SCDHHS is responsible for the supervision and monitoring of IDEA/Part C providers and programs including:

- Supervising and monitoring programs and activities that comprise the early intervention system, including agencies, institutions, organizations, and individuals which provide Early Intervention Services (EIS) to children eligible for IDEA/Part C and their families. Monitoring processes include, but are not limited to, compliance with IDEA/Part C and the provisions of federal and state regulations, policies, and procedures, whether or not the programs or activities receive financial assistance under IDEA/Part C, including fiscal compliance.
- Providing, or facilitating the provision of, technical assistance to those agencies, institutions, and organizations including self-evaluation, program planning and implementation. Staff of IDEA/Part C State Office will utilize monthly meetings with local early intervention system teams, at least one per each of the four geographic regions utilized by SCDHHS, as one mechanism by which technical assistance and monitoring feedback may be provided.
- Enforcing obligations imposed on those participating state agencies, companies and organizations as required under these regulations.
- Ensuring that deficiencies identified through monitoring are corrected and taking appropriate action in the event non-compliance reoccurs.
